## Focus On... PSC's Directory Recycling Program

Each year, PSC partners with area schools and the Solid Waste Management Districts in the three counties for a directory recycling program. PSC pays each participating school \$.25 for each PSC Regional Directory collected. As a bonus, each school collecting at least 25% more directories than they did in the previous year receives \$.35 per PSC directory collected. PSC directories dropped off at the county drop sites are also credited at \$.25 and those dollars are divided among the schools participating in that county.

■ *Since the program's beginning in March, 1995, area school children, with the help of supportive citizens, have collected almost 130,000 PSC Regional Directories. This results in donations totaling over \$36,000 to participating schools.*

The 2008 PSC Regional Directory should be delivered around the time you receive this newsletter. Schools participating this year will be collecting directories beginning April 1st and continuing through April 18th. If you have any old directories, chances are good that someone you

know is collecting them for their school. If not, drop them off at your county's Solid Waste Management District. Their locations are on page 47 of your new PSC Regional Directory.
